

Merrick County Board Minutes



January 10, 2017

The Merrick County Board of Supervisors met Tuesday, January 10, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in the Supervisors Room, County Courthouse, Central City, NE, with Graves, Helgoth, Carlson, Kreachbaum, Weller, Kucera, and Wiegert present. County Attorney Lynelle Homolka was also present.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publications in the Republican Nonpareil and The Palmer Journal and the Merrick County Website. Proof of publication is filed in the Clerk's Office. Copies of the agenda were mailed to each Supervisor and kept current and available to the public at the County Clerk's Office.

Chairman Wiegert declared the meeting was preceded by publicized notice and having acknowledged and identified the location of the posting of the current copy of the Open Meetings Act, called the meeting to order and in open session at 9:00 a.m.

Kreachbaum led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Moved Kucera, second Graves to convene as Board of Supervisors and to reorganize at 9:00 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes

Agenda: Moved Carlson, second Kucera to approve the agenda as presented. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Reorganization: Moved Kucera, second Graves to reorganize. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Chairman: Moved Graves, second Carlson to elect Roger Wiegert as Chairman for 2017. Roll Call: All Ayes: All Ayes.

Vice Chairman: Moved Helgoth, second Kucera to elect Jimmie Graves as Vice Chairman for 2017. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Appointment of Board of Equalization: Moved Graves, second Carlson to appoint the Board of Supervisors at the Board of Equalization. Roll Call: All Ayes.

2017 meeting schedule: Moved Kucera, second Weller to approve the 2017 meeting schedule with the Board of Supervisor and Board of Equalization meetings being the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month except in February, and the first meeting will be Thursday, February 23, 2017, The last meeting in April will be Monday, April 24, 2017 in order to get payroll out on time, November, the second meeting will be Monday, November 27, 2017 in order to get payroll out on time and 12 holidays for 2017 and January 1, 2018. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Holidays: Moved Helgoth, second Kucera to approve the 12 holidays for 2017 and January 1, 2018. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Official means of publication: Moved Kreachbaum, second Kucera to approve the Palmer Journal, Republican Nonpareil, and the County Website as the official means of publication for 2017. Roll Call: All Ayes.

County Depository Banks: Moved Weller, second Graves to designate the Bank of Clarks located in Clarks, NE, Farmers State Bank, a branch of the Bank of Clarks, located in Silver Creek, Central Bank, Cornerstone Bank, and Pinnacle Bank Central City, located in Central City, and Pinnacle Bank Palmer, located in Palmer as the county depository banks and NPAIT as a depository for Merrick County. County Bond: Moved Graves, second Kreachbaum to adopt the blanket bond of Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (NIRMA) insured under Certificate of Insurance Master Policy #N-CR0607-46, Producer NIRMA, Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Association, a Risk Management Pool, at Lincoln, NE. Said blanket bond continues as long as Merrick County is a member county of NIRMA and said Master Policy #N-CR0607-46 remains in effect. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Highway Superintendent: Moved Graves, second Kreachbaum to appoint Mike Meyer as the Merrick County Highway Superintendent and to designate him to negotiate the Right of Way Agreements for Merrick County for 2017. NRD Advisory Committee: Moved Carlson, second Graves to appoint Mike Meyer to the advisory committee for the NRD for 2017. Roll Call: All Ayes.

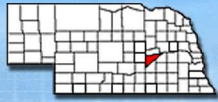
Emergency Management & Homeland Security Program: Moved Kreachbaum, second Kucera to appoint Thomas Smith to the Emergency Management and Homeland Security Program of the East Central Region for Planning, Exercise, Training, and Interoperable Communications. Roll Call: All Ayes.

E-911 surcharges: Moved Graves, second Carlson to set the E-911 surcharge rates at \$1.00. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Committees: Moved Graves, second Kucera to approve the committee appointments. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Boards: Moved Graves, second Carlson to approve the appointment of Board members to Board. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Minutes: Moved Helgoth, second Weller to approve the minutes of the December 27, 2016 meeting. Roll Call: Carlson, Kreachbaum, Kucera, Weller, Helgoth, and Wiegert. Nays: None. Abstain: Graves.



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Meeting reports: Carlson made a few trips out to the 4H Building; Graves attended 2 NIRMA meetings and a hospital meeting; Weller attended the Central District Health meeting; Kreachbaum attended the 4H Building Overseers meeting and an Emergency Management meeting and Wiegert attended the 4H Building Overseers meeting.

Official reports: Highway Superintendent Meyer handed out the result for the County Bridge Match Program. Assessor Placke said her office is planning the appreciation dinner that will probably be in February. Treasurer Bolte went of the E911 funds with the Board and let the Board know that they would be needing a special meeting to transfer funds into the Courthouse Bond Fund to cover the principal and interest payment. The special meetings is scheduled for Friday, January 13, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. Sheriff Westman introduced his new Chief Deputy Pat Benson.

Road closing hearing: Moved Graves, second Kucera at 10:05 a.m. to open the hearing for the road closing on 16th Road between “X” and “Y” Roads. Roll Call: All Ayes. Moved Graves, second Kucera to go out of the hearing at 10:09 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes. Moved Graves, second Kucera to leave 16th Road between “X” and “Y” Roads open. Roll Call: All Ayes.

4H arena: Russ Kucera reported that turning the temperature down in the arena was not the answer to the moisture problem in the arena area. Kucera has put magnesium pellets down and that has helped but the arena is tightly built and something else will need to be done. Fans will help some but they will need to be a ventilation system of some kind. Rathman had given a price of \$57,000.00 for ventilation. The Board would like to visit with Rathman to see what the \$57,000.00 included at their next meeting.

Public comment: Kent Frenzen challenged the Board to stay on task with the 4H Building.

Preventive Maintenance agreement: Moved Helgoth, second Kucera to table the approval and signing of the Customer Preventive Maintenance Agreement between Electrical Engineering & Equipment Company and Merrick County Supervisors for a yearly fee of \$520.00 for maintenance once per year on the standby generator system at 1780 Fairgrounds Road until the next meeting because they want more information. Roll Call: All Ayes.

4H Building expenses: Extension Educator Stuhr wanted the Boards guidance on where certain bills for the 4H Building will be coming out of. The electric, gas, cleaning supplies, fire suppression phone lines, fire suppression monitoring, and part of the trash bill will come out of the rental revenue. The cleaning labor, cleaning equipment, and monthly rug service will come out of the Building & Grounds budget. The yearly generator services, internet service and part of the trash bills will come out of the extension budget. The property and liability insurance will come out of the miscellaneous budget.

4H Building Overseers Committee: Extension Educator Stuhr gave a review to the County Board on the new 4H Building’s use and what exceptions have been granted and what still needs to be fixed that was discussed at the Overseers’ meetings.

Emergency Management training: Emergency Manager Tom Smith went over the upcoming training meetings for elected officials for emergency management and there locations.

SCALES: Moved Helgoth, second Graves to approve and have the Chairman and County Sheriff Westman sign the SCALES addendum. Roll Call: All Ayes.

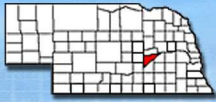
Relocation of Sheriff’s Office: Sheriff Westman and the Board discussed the relocation of the jail.
