

Merrick County Board Minutes



May 14, 2019

The Merrick County Board of Supervisors met Tuesday, May 14, 2019 at 9:08 a.m. in the Supervisors Room, County Courthouse, Central City, NE, with Kreachbaum, Kucera, Dexter, Placke, Yrkoski, Weller, and Wiegert present. County Attorney Homolka was also present.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publications in the Republican Nonpareil and The Palmer Journal and the Merrick County Website. Proof of publication is filed in the Clerk's Office. Copies of the agenda were mailed to each Supervisor and kept current and available to the public at the County Clerk's Office.

Chairman Wiegert declared the meeting was preceded by publicized notice and having acknowledged and identified the location of the posting of the current copy of the Open Meetings Act, called the meeting to order and in open session at 9:08 a.m.

Moved Kucera, second Placke to convene as Board of Supervisors at 9:08 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes

Agenda: Moved Weller, second Yrkoski to approve the agenda as presented. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Minutes: Moved Dexter, second Kreachbaum to approve the minutes of April 23, 2019 as published. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Meeting reports: Weller, Dexter, Placke, Yrkoski, Kucera, and Wiegert attended a retreat with elected and appointed officials on Friday, May 3, 2019: Weller attended the Central District Meeting on Monday, May 13, 2019; Dexter attended the Merrick County Economic Development Meeting; Kreachbaum attended a meeting with the Emergency Manager and they went over the budget for all three counties; Kucera attended the Extension Board Meeting on Tuesday, May 7, 2019 and went over their budget and Wiegert attended the Midland Area on Aging Meeting on Thursday, May 2, 2019

Official reports: Veteran Service Officer Tom Reimers said his numbers of client that came into his office was down but he was still helping a lot of veterans. Highway Superintendent Meyer said he had an employee that hurt themselves outside of work and their doctor will not let them return to work until next week and has run out of vacation, comp, and sick leave. Another employee volunteered 40 hours of his sick time to the injured employee but Meyer was not aware that it needed prior approval of the County Board and so it did not get on the agenda. The Board directed the County Clerk to allow the donation to be used for this pay period and to put the approval on the next agenda. Treasurer Gilg said that 62% of the 2018 taxes have been paid.

Health Insurance: Moved Kreachbaum, second Yrkoski to approve and have the Chairman sign the new subgroup application for the fiscal year 2019-2020 for BlueCross Blueshield with the new lower rates with the county paying 100% or \$966.68 for single, 85% or \$1,649.43 for employee and spouse and employee and children with the employee paying 15% or \$291.07 and 80% or \$1,776.03 for employee and family and the employee paying 20% or \$444.01. Roll Call: All Ayes.

AFLAC: Moved Placke, second Yrkoski to offer the AFLAC MeMD plan free to all of the employees enrolled in AFLAC with no cost to either the county or employee. Roll Call: All Ayes.

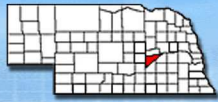
Pledge Securities: The Pledge Securities report was read to the Board by the County Treasurer. Treasurer Gilg said she has updated all of the pledge securities.

RESOLUTION 2019-9: Moved Weller, second Dexter to approve and have the Chairman sign RESOLUTION 2019-9 directing the County to pay the Courthouse Bond interest payment in the amount of \$6,967.50 ON June 1, 2019 out of Fund 3000. Roll Call: All Ayes. RESOLUTION 2019-9 is on file in the County Clerk's Office for public viewing.

RESOLUTION 2019-10: Moved Placke, second Weller to approve and have the Chairman sign RESOLUTION 2019-10 directing the County Treasurer to pay the 4H Building Bond interest payment in the amount of \$20,548.75 due June 1, 2019 out of Fund 3400. Roll Call: All Ayes. RESOLUTION 2019-10 is on file in the County Clerk's Office for public viewing.

Planning & Zoning GWorks: Planning & Zoning Lyons asked the Board to table this topic until she was able to get more information for the Board. Moved Weller, second Dexter to table GWorks for Planning & Zoning. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Public Hearing 10:00 a.m.: Moved Kucera, second Kreachbaum to open the public hearing to consider amending the Merrick County Comprehensive Plan, Future Land Use Map at 10:00 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes. Planning and Zoning Lyons explained to the Board that rezoning cannot happen until an amendment is done and if the amendment is denied property cannot be rezoned changing part of the NW ¼ of Section 27, Township 12, Range 8 owned by Kirby Knight from Agricultural Preservation District to Lakeside Residential District. Jeff Thomas, and adjacent property owner south of Knight's property has concerns with drainage, ditches, noise, and opening up for other properties to rezone. Lyons said there is a provision in the comprehensive plan for lakeside property. Kirby Knight also has concerns with ditches and drainage. Knight stated that it has been going on for many years due to a berm that the state had built east of his property.



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Knight shared his idea for diverting the water. He would like this taken care of before he would develop anything. Knight said there was room for 10 to 14 lots and that Olson and Associates is working the DEQ on this project and that a site plan has been developed for installation of wells and septic systems. Moved Kucera, second Placke to close the hearing at 10:31 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes. Moved Kucera, second Placke to approve amending the County Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map based on the following finding of facts: 1. The existing uses of the land and zoning classifications of property in the area will not be affected by the proposed amendment, as evidenced by: not currently being used as agriculture; 2. The property is suitable to the new zoning classification, as evidenced by is compatible with lakeside residential standards; 3. The proposed amendment is an appropriate use of land, as evidenced by is compatible with special policies #2 and #3; 4. The proposed amendment is in concordance with Merrick County's zoning regulations, as comprehensive plan and land use; 5. The property is accessible to County services; streets and roads; sewage and water facilities and refuse and disposal services, as evidenced by it is adjoining State Highway 30, and working with DEQ for services; 6. The general health, safety, and welfare of the community will be maintained if the amendment is made, as evidenced by applicants are working the DEQ and Olson & Associates to develop an appropriate site plan for septic and well placement. The property is not in the flood plain. Roll Call: All Ayes.

Public Hearing 10:15 a.m.: Moved Kucera, second Placke to open the public hearing at 10:15 a.m. to hear the request to rezone part of the NW1/4 of Section 27, Township 12, Range 8, Merrick County, Nebraska from Agricultural Preservation District to Lakeside Residential District. Roll Call: All Ayes. Moved Kucera, second Yrkoski to go out of the public hearing at a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes. Moved Kucera, second Kreachbaum to approve the rezoning of part of the NW ¼ of Section 27, Township 12, Range 8 from Agricultural Preservation District to Lakeside Residential District with the finding of facts: 1. The existing use of land and zoning classification of the property is allowed in the Merrick County Comprehensive Plan, Lakeside Residential District if the property is rezoned as evidenced by provides approval in compatible use; 2. The property is suitable to the new zoning classification, as evidenced by provided in special policies; 3. The proposed rezoning is an appropriate use of land, as evidenced by non-agricultural –non compatible uses listed; 4. The rezoned property is accessible to County services; streets, and roads; sewage and water facilities and refuse and disposal services as evidenced by adjacent to State Highway 30, private wells and sewer; 5. Rezoning the property will not be detrimental to or endanger public health, safety, comfort or general welfare of the community as evidenced by applicant is working with DEQ and Olson & Associates for site plan for sewer & Septic & the property is not in the flood plain; 6. Rezoning will not impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the District, as evidenced by separate property from agriculture and not in the flood plain; 7. Rezoning shall not include noise, which is objectionable due to volume, frequency, beat unless muffled or otherwise controlled according to the Merrick County Comprehensive Plan as evidenced by noise from recreational activities will be controlled by proposed confidence of operation; 8. Rezoning shall not involve any direct or reflected glare, which is visible from any adjoining property or from any public street, road or highway according to the Merrick County Comprehensive Plan as evidenced by building sites do not sit close to public streets, roads, or highways; 9. Rezoning the property shall not involve any activity substantially increasing the burden on any public utilities or facilities unless provisions are made for necessary adjustments according to the Merrick County Comprehensive Plan as evidenced by will have own septic and wells according to DEQ so will not be an additional burden.
