The Merrick County Board of Supervisors met Tuesday, April 8, 2025 at 9:05 a.m. in the Supervisors Room, County Courthouse, Central City, NE, with Kreachbaum, Jarecke, Dexter, Wiegert, Placke, Kucera, Weller, and County Clerk Strobel present.

Notice of the meeting was given thereof by publications in the Republican Nonpareil and The Palmer Journal and the Merrick County Website. Proof of publication is filed in the Clerk's Office. Copies of the agenda were given to each Supervisor and kept current and available to the public at the County Clerk's Office.

Chairwoman Kucera declared the meeting was preceded by publicized notice and having acknowledged and identified the location of the posting of the current copy of the Open Meetings Act, called the meeting to order and in open session at 9:05 a.m. Moved Kreachbaum, second Dexter to convene as Board of Supervisors at 9:05 a.m. Roll Call: All Ayes

Agenda: Moved Placke, second Dexter to approve the agenda as presented. Roll Call: All Ayes Minutes: Moved Dexter, second Wiegert to approve the minutes from March 25, 2025 with the addition of Kreachbaum attending Long Term Care Board meeting March 21st. Roll Call: All Ayes Meeting Reports: Township meeting April 3rd-Dexter, Placke, Kreachbaum, Wiegert, Kucera, Jarecke; Dexter and Kucera-Five Nines at the courthouse April 7; Dexter- RDG at Long-Term Care April 8 and Merrick Economic Development April 4; Wiegert-4H Building March 31 and Midland Area on Aging April 3rd; Kreachbaum-March 31st 4H Building Special Committee meeting, March 26th participated in the Connecting the Dots at the high school.

Officials Reports: Assessor Myers stated March 19th was the date all valuations needed to be set. Reports and opinions for Merrick County are available online. 73% Agriculture; 94% Residential and 98% Commercial for 2025. Assessor Myers stated the valuation notices will be mailed out June 1. Anna Sedlacek-Human Resources, is needing one more in person meeting with the officials and handbook committee to go over Bereavement Leave. Sedlacek will be meeting with Strobel to look over any contracts or monthly invoices to determine spending utilization. Sedlacek will also be meeting with the Extension Office on Wednesday. Treasurer Gilg stated the board to date, 27% of taxes have been collected for 2024. Highway Superintendent Kunze communicated Von Ohlen Bridge is now open to traffic. 22nd and V will possibly be open next week and Worms Highway should be done with resurfacing next week as well. Kunze and Kucera will be meeting in Hamilton County on Wednesday regarding bundling grants with other counties for bridges and paving. Kunze handed out packets for potential equipment and building plans/purchases for the next five years, as well as a Preliminary Pavement Rehab Plan.

Jim Edinger and Nick Blase with Hamilton Telecommunications approached the board to sign a Letter of Support for a broadband grant application. Moved Jarecke, second Dexter to have the chairwoman sign the Letter of Support. Roll Call: All Ayes

Melissa VanDeWalle provided a Long-Term Care update. RDG will be doing their walk through the facility until 3:00 p.m. today.

Moved Dexter, second Kreachbaum to approve the appointment of Rick Tank, Kendra Jefferson, Betty Wemhoff and Deb Spencer to the Long-Term Care Board. Roll Call: All Ayes

Moved Kreachbaum, second Dexter to approve the chairwoman to sign the Annual Noxious Weed program 2024 evaluation as presented. Roll Call: All Ayes

Discussion regarding repair to a bridge on 22nd and A Road over Prairie Creek. Highway Superintendent Kunze received an estimate for a bridge abutment repair was \$99,698.00, an entire new bridge would be estimated at approximately \$4000.00/linear ft. The board decided to have an engineer provide replacement options.

Clerk Strobel informed the board the budget request sheets had been handed out to all department heads, with a date of May 2nd to have the preliminary requests turned into the clerk's office. The board decided the department heads could use a 2.5% increase on wages to help estimate potential costs. This does not mean it could not change before the budget is approved.
